	1st (AUST) Siege Battery.	342	Sergeant John George DWYER. (R.A.A.)	<p>At GODDIE DREVE FARM on 5rd February, 1918, while the battery was being heavily shelled by the enemy, one round fell on a cartridge dump near No: 3 Gun. It ignited some of the cartridges which in turn set the camouflage on fire. The burning camouflage continued to set alight other cartridges and was threatening all the dumps on the guns in the remainder of the battery. At great personal risk, Sergt: DWYER, together with Bombr: DRUITT and L/Bdr: JACKSON, went out during gun-fire and put out the camouflage, thereby saving many rounds ( up to 150 ).</p> <p>Sergt: DWYER has at all times shown great devotion to duty and disregard of danger.</p> <p>Forwarded to 36th (AUST) Bde.
